Grant Application with the Department of Justice's Community Oriented Policing Services for the 2018 STOP School Violence: School Violence Prevention Program on behalf of the Pinellas County School Board.

#### Summary:

This grant application provides funding for the SVPP that will be implemented by the Pinellas County School Board. This program is designed to improve school security through evidence-based school safety interventions for acquisition and installation of technology for expedited notification of local law enforcement during an emergency.

The SVPP is part of a two-phase plan to deploy a centralized and automated lockdown system in each of Pinellas County's 122 schools. The system will provide first responders and law enforcement interactive access to live information during the event of an active assailant or other emergency incident.

#### **Background/Explanation:**

The SVPP is part of comprehensive school safety planning efforts in Pinellas County to establish and enhance school safety equipment to prevent violence in Pinellas County schools. Phase I is to provide the infrastructure for this system in all Pinellas County schools. Phase II is to build upon the infrastructure with enhanced cutting-edge technology blended with best practices to meet the challenges of constantly evolving threats.

If the grant is awarded, SVPP funds will provide the Phase I infrastructure components necessary to not only expedite notification of local law enforcement during a school emergency, but reduce opportunities for human error and call system malfunctions.

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# **Fiscal Impact:**

The grant application is for \$488,365.20 in federal funding for a two-year funding period starting October 1, 2018 to September 30, 2020. A 25% local match is required; the Pinellas County School Board will provide the full amount of the match totaling \$162,788.40 from capital outlay funds.
